
School Ambassador Job Descriptions

- To always model and promote the character behaviours








Reading Ambassador:

- To count out resources and distributing to classrooms

STEM Ambassador:

- Help teachers to set up for science lessons and to help return resources to the science cupboard
- Help teachers to set up for DT lessons and enrichment days and to help return resources to the science cupboard
- To help the science champions to organise the resources
- To inform the science champions when we are running out of consumable items (e.g. batteries and bulbs)
- To be patient and encourage children to try

Playground Ambassador:


- To learn playground games and teach these to children on the playground
